Ilter Ibrahimof, Artistic Director of Fall for Dance North, to be first recipient of The Sandra Faire Next Generation Award

January 31, 2020 – Ilter Ibrahimof has been chosen as the first recipient of The Sandra Faire Next Generation Award and will be recognized at this year's induction event. **Ivan Fecan** who received the 2019 Community Builder award along with his late wife, **Sandra Faire**, has generously sponsored the award in her name.

Ibrahimof is the co-founder and Artistic Director of Fall for Dance North (FFDN) in Toronto, Ontario. FFDN celebrated its 5th Anniversary Season in 2019 and has established itself as a premier international dance festival.

A new addition to the Dance Collection Danse Hall of Fame, The Sandra Faire Next Generation Award celebrates a young contributor who has made a significant impact on the Canadian dance field. This acknowledgment can include dancers, choreographers, philanthropists, and arts administrators.

Ivan Fecan says, "Sandra Faire loved all aspects of dance, but in particular enjoyed encouraging young talent. The Sandra Faire Next Generation Award is a wonderful tribute to her memory. I am grateful to be given the opportunity to underwrite this prize."
